"Increasing evidence suggests that access to nature and green space enhances academic performance and long-term outcomes, including stress reduction and the capacity to self-regulate," said Michelle Kinder, executive director, Momentous Institute. "The outdoor classroom will facilitate play-based education and, as seen in studies, will ultimately result in significant enhancements in children's language growth."

Momentous Institute provides resources to build and repair social emotional health in the Dallas-Fort Worth community, specifically focused on children and families who experience toxic stress due to poverty or trauma. Each year, Momentous Institute's education programs and therapeutic services reach 6,000 children and family members. The PNC grant will provide Momentous Institute with an innovative tool – the Nature Explore Outdoor Classroom – to serve its students on their journey to building social emotional health, as well as proficiency in literacy and English skills.
