Local Arts Organizations Share \$250,000 From PNC Arts Alive

Nine Arts Groups Benefit from the Eighth Year of PNC's Community Contributions

ST. LOUIS, May 9, 2018 – A ghost story dance depiction, fashion design education programs and a new sensory-friendly symphony series are among the plans for nine St. Louis-area arts organizations receiving grants from the PNC Foundation through <u>PNC Arts Alive</u>.



For the eighth straight year, PNC is contributing \$250,000 to arts organizations across the Greater St. Louis region as part of its 10-year commitment to local visual and performing arts. The 2018 grant recipients cover a wide range of disciplines, audiences and participatory experiences from arts groups large and small, encompassing the city and suburban areas. One local arts organization, the Saint Louis Fashion Fund, is receiving PNC Arts Alive funding for the first time to create a mobile education center. [See below for full list of grant recipients]

First launched in 2010, PNC Arts Alive has already provided 92 grants to local, non-profit arts groups. The program has earned local and national commendation from the Missouri Arts Council, the Arts and Education Council in St. Louis and Americans for the Arts in New York City. Additionally, in the spring of 2016, PNC announced it would extend PNC Arts Alive for four more years by granting an additional \$1 million.

PNC Arts Alive is a multi-year grant initiative of the PNC Foundation that challenges visual and performing arts organizations to put forth their best, most original thinking in expanding audience participation and engagement. The performances will innovate the concert experience to remove barriers for children with autism and other disabilities that cause sensory sensitivities. This series will enable these youth to enjoy live orchestral music in a safe, friendly environment.

The Big Muddy Dance Company

Lemp Legends: A Ghost Story will be the first concert dance depiction of the Lemp family story, as well as being one of the first depictions of a historical St. Louis story. The performance will portray the eerie tale of the regionally infamous Lemp Mansion and brewery through flashbacks of their dramatic family story of triumph, sickness, loss, divorce, suicide, fortune and legacy.

Making a Scene: A St. Louis Theatre Expo Presented by PNC Arts Alive will bring numerous St. Louis theatres under The Rep's roof to provide the community with a unique, behind-the-scenes experience about the process of creating theatre. With The Rep's first Mainstage 2018-2019 production at the center, the expo will provide tours, exhibits, features, discussions and pop-up performances.
