PNC Arts Alive Grants \$185,000 To Palm Beach Cultural Organizations Over Three Years

- Thousands of local children will benefit from the first year of #PNCArtsAlive contributions in Palm Beach County
- Six local groups plan to boost creativity in visual and performing arts
- Visual arts programs range from live symphonic orchestra performances to a visual arts festival and outdoor ballets to digital storytelling



WEST PALM BEACH, Nov. 3, 2016 – Access to free classical ballet performances, Latino & African-American musical theater, a visual arts festival, 59-piece orchestra performances, critical-thinking digital stories and transportation to a fall concert are among the highlights of six Palm Beach arts organizations, which will receive funds totaling \$75,000 this year from the PNC Foundation's <u>Arts Alive</u> program.

The awards are part of a three-year, \$185,000 commitment PNC announced today at the Armory Art Center to bring PNC Arts Alive to Palm Beach County. The non-profit winners represents a wide range of disciplines, audiences and participatory experiences from arts groups' large and small, city and suburban. Throughout 2016, PNC has diligently worked with the Cultural Council of Palm Beach County to develop and bring the Arts Alive initiative to its thriving community.

The Cultural Council of Greater Palm Beach County reports that its creative economy has a \$2.4 billion impact on the region. PNC Arts Alive adds richness to local efforts by awarding grants to arts organizations that support fresh and emerging arts programs, value-added public programming and creative use of technology, while seeking to expand audiences.

Bringing more people to the Armory Art Center campus will bring more awareness of what we offer—resulting in higher participation in our high-quality visual arts programming for youth and adults, attendance to the exhibitions hosted in our galleries, and support for our outreach programs providing healing and education to those with special needs."

PNC ARTS ALIVE – 2016 GRANT RECIPIENTS

Armory Art Center

The Armory Art Center is organizing a visual arts festival to be held on site, December 3 - 4, 2016. Free to the public, this two day event will feature booths exhibiting and selling the work of local artists, live arts demonstrations, children's activities and crafts and local food and music.

Boca Ballet Theatre

Community Dance Concert is a one-night only, free outdoor public performance at Mizner Park Amphitheater in Boca Raton. This unique show will include classical ballet and contemporary choreography performed by young people who reside in the Boca Raton Housing Authority's Pearl City community, people with Parkinson's disease, students in the School of BBT and professional dancers from some of the top ballet companies in the country.

Core Ensemble

The Core Ensemble will offer three artist residencies with actress Rosa Rodriguez presenting music theatre work Tres Vidas, focused on famous & influential Hispanics in history; actor Dracyn Blount Of Ebony Embers will present vignettes of the Harlem Renaissance featuring music and poetry of the Jazz Age; and actress Deltoiya Goodman will offer performances and educational programs celebrating Women's History Month and the achievements of African American women. These performances are open to the public and free.

Palm Beach DramaWorks Ethics Project

The Ethics Project is an interactive, educational project geared toward high school students that examines and promotes personal responsibility and originality. Students are given critical-thinking prompts, and are then asked to research, edit, and create a 'digital story' focused on ethical dilemmas. These digital stories are then submitted to Palm Beach Dramaworks. Then, 650 students from Title 1 schools are invited at no cost to field trip performances of Collected Stories by Donald Margulies. Immediately following the performance students will participate in a guided talkback on plagiarism, ethical dilemmas and intellectual property rights

Palm Beach Symphony – Children's Concerts

The Palm Beach Symphony (PBS) will expose 4,000 students to the enchantment and rigor of classical music in hopes of developing critical thinking skills and the overall appreciation for arts and culture. Four free performances with a full orchestra (59 musicians) will be paired with classroom discussions to allow students to appreciate, interpret, and create with artistic intent. These children's concert performances will feature internationally recognized Peter and the Wolf by Sergei Prokofiev. Along with narration and ballet, the musicians bring the characters of Peter

and the Wolf to life as Palm Beach County elementary and middle school students learn about the different instruments in an orchestra.

Delray Beach Chorale – Transportation

Arts Alive funding will provide transportation of young children to the Delray Chorale's Fall Concert on December 9, 2016 at the Roberts Theatre, Boca Raton, FL. The funding will also contribute in providing lesson plans and materials to participating schools so these children will be taught and begin to understand and appreciate great classical choral works.
